What it's about: Objects are made of their letters in this innovative program -- the letters "B-R-I-D-G-E" form a bridge, for example, or the letters "D-U-C-K" (above) morph into a duck. In each episode, the animated Word-Friends have adventures that help develop prereading skills and show the importance of such things as sharing and patience.
